The CSMC took note of letter no. 2467-UD/0/M/SB/S-21/05 dt. 28.07.06 from the Government of West Bengal regarding repeal of Urban Land Ceiling Act 1976. It was noted that the State Government of West Bengal has recently constituted a Committee under the Chairmanship of Sh. S.S. Chattopadhyay, former Secretary (UEPA), Government of India, to examine issue of adoption Urban Land (Ceiling and regulation) Repeal Act 1999 and simultaneously suggest measures for creation of monopoly ownership of urban land with its equitable development and management protecting interests of socially and economically backward sections of urban population. The State Government of West Bengal has decided, 'in principle', to consider adoption of Repeal Act and complete the process within a period of two and a half years i.e. by the 4<sup>th</sup> year.
